
# Lamplighter

### Pikes Peak United Methodist Church July and June

Reports from the June and July meetings of Dorothy Circle are being combined and presented as one report. After reading the purpose of the UMW, at each meeting, we heard the Spiritual Growth reading, then went immediately to the program.

June's theme was for each woman to share what she felt was her God given purpose for her life. We discovered that each woman had more than one gift that she uses to the glory of God. Several ladies had similar gifts.

After each program, President Brown read several thank you notes from previous speakers over the last few months. It is a privilege to host speakers from non-profit groups who strive to serve the least, the lost, and the often forgotten.

July's speaker was from West Side Cares. For the last two years we have heard about the impact that our neighboring organization has made on the westside. They have a new CEO who is smart and very skilled in working with the homeless and disadvantaged! Some remodeling of their facility and many new programs have already taken place.

We heard how West Side Cares helps the 'working poor' (those with have jobs but unable to afford even the basic

necessities) who make up 15% of their clientele. It was wonderful to hear how their agency is working with local families and single people to improve the quality of life for these, our needy neighbors! When asked about where the sock donations go, we were told they are carefully rationed. The other item they need are women's hygiene supplies which can be placed into the red wagon each week.

Our membership is pursuing how we might be able to impact a more global community. We will talk about this at our August meeting that will be held on Thursday, August 2, at 1:30. All women are invited to attend. Both June and July meetings were ended with light refreshments provided by our membership. We end each meeting with the United Methodist Prayer which we all read together.

### "God of our Fathers, Whose Almighty Hand"

This grand hymn, written by the Reverend Daniel C. Roberts (1841-1907) was first sung in the town of Brandon, Vermont on July 4, 1876. . The citizens of Brandon had long anticipated the celebration of the first century of American Independence and had asked the Reverend Daniel C. Roberts of the Protestant church if he would write an appropriate hymn for them to sing on that special day! All over the country celebrations were exploding as Americans gathered with prayers, speeches, parades and the singing of hymns; thanking God for His blessings and guidance upon their land! This celebration was made all the more impressive as the Civil War had ended only eleven years earlier and there was rejoicing that America still stood, United! Daniel C. Roberts had served with Ohio's 84th infantry, and Brandon's citizens felt it was fitting that a veteran should author their song of praise! It is considered the National Hymn of the United States of America.

If you or someone you know are in one of these situations, the small group program called JustFaith may be of interest.

Through an 8-week program of reflection, discussion and encounter, participants explore today's issues through the lens of their faith, engage in dialogue around those issues, and formulate a personal/group response. Participants are invited into a process of learning and discovering how to live more simply and compassionately, while getting to know each other and grow in their faith and outreach together.

Across the country, JustFaith has been known to stir individuals and groups to engage more deeply in their relationship with God and with each other. Many participants have found JustFaith to be a springboard for collaborative action in the living out of their faith values, and an opportunity to re-energize their commitment to service. For this reason, **Westside CARES** is gauging interest in forming a JustFaith group. Jim was a good Christian man and did a lot of work here at the church. I have many fond memories of him.


He was always there to do and help with anything that was needed.
